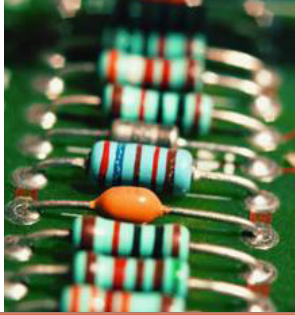

MARION COUNTY, IOWA ADVANTAGES

Our Location

Marion County, Iowa lies adjacent to the intersection of I-35 and I-80, providing north/south and east/west connections. Within the county, State Highways 14, 92, 5 and 163 intersect and connect it to Des Moines. State Highways 5 and 163 also provide quick 4-lane access. Within a one-hour drive, Marion County has access to the Des Moines International Airport, the major airport hub for the region directly to 24 US cities.

Our Utility Partners

Electrical costs in Marion County are less than the national average. Electric service is rated 6.3 out of 7 for satisfaction by existing companies.

Our Skilled Workforce

93.3% percent of working age adults age 25+ within Marion County, Iowa have a high school diploma ranking the county 356 out of 3,141 US counties. Skilled labor costs are competitive and existing companies rate productivity of workforce at 5.66 as compared to 5.52 statewide.

Our Machinery & Component Manufacturing Sector Growth Projections

EMSI projects regional growth in subsectors from 2020 to 2025 as follows: 61% Other Electronic Components Mfg., 50% Fluid Power Valve & Hose Fitting Mfg., 50% Truck Trailer Mfg., 40% Gear & Industrial High-Speed Drive Mfg., and 49% Measuring & Controlling Instruments Mfg.

ACCESS TO MARKETS



TRANSPORTATION

LOCATION: Marion County, Iowa is located in the Central time zone.

HIGHWAY: Being located within 30 minutes of the intersection of I-80 and I-35 provides ease of access to markets within the midwest and nation. State Highways 5 and 163 provide 4-lane access from Des Moines to Marion County.

RAIL: A new transload facility under construction by Des Moines Industrial is within 30 minutes of Marion County and will provide additional rail options. The transload site has direct access to Iowa Interstate Railroad, Norfolk Southern and BNSF railroads. There are two class 1 rail lines in Marion County, Iowa. The BNSF and Union Pacific rail lines connect the county to Des Moines as well as the nation.

AIR: Within a one-hour drive, Marion County has access to the Des Moines International Airport, the major airport hub for the region directly to 24 US cities. Iowa's airports transport 175M pounds of cargo annually.

EDUCATION & TRAINING

HIGHER EDUCATION: Within a one hour drive of Marion County, Iowa you can connect with four-year and two year schools which offer opportunities for training:

SKILLED WORKFORCE

Right to Work State: Under Iowa law, an employee must not be required to join a union or pay dues or fees to any labor union, association or organization as a condition of employment.

New Jobs Incentives: Iowa offers training incentives and an array of financial assistance programs to make starting a business in Iowa easier. The High Quality Jobs Creation Program, Iowa New Jobs Training Program and Iowa New Jobs Tax Credits are just some of the Iowa programs available.
